ROUTT COUNTY CHILD CARE NEEDS ASSESSMENT REPORT

To identify a plan to address gaps in the system, the Craig-Scheckman Family Foundation (CSFF) and First Impressions of Routt County commissioned this needs assessment in October 2022 to clearly understand the state of early care and education (ECE) in the county.

Between October 2022 and July 2023, researchers from the Butler Institute for Families at the University of Denver (Butler) collected data to understand the supply of and demand for ECE services of children birth through age 8 in Routt County. The needs assessment used secondary data, interviews and focus groups, and surveys to collect data from ECE providers, families, and systems-level partners.

WHAT WE HAVE BEEN WORKING ON!

UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL UPK

Universal Preschool (UPK) allows families to choose the right setting for their child, whether it is in a licensed community-based, school-based or home-based preschool

Families of children in the year before they are eligible for kindergarten, and qualifying 3-year-olds, can apply for UPK Colorado for the 2023-24 school year.

First Impressions is the Local Coordinator Organization for all things related to UPK

BY THE NUMBERS

- As of December 2023 we have 12 participating UPK providers
- 157 4 year olds are enrolled with participating providers



TUITION ASSISTANCE

First Impressions offers assistance to help offset the cost of tuition. Eligible children must be enrolled or eligible for enrollment in a participating, licensed, childcare center, family childcare home or preschool program in Routt

First Impressions Tuition Assistance supports families up to 400% FPL to pay no more than 14% of their monthly income towards child care/preschool

By the numbers

 As of December 2023, our tuition assistance programs have supported 33 working families with \$125,550 across 9 licensed centers.

WHAT WE HAVE BEEN WORKING ON!

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIP

Quality early learning options require a qualified, fairly compensated early childhood workforce. First Impressions works to ensure safe, nurturing, and engaging early learning environments are a choice for all of Routt County's young children.

During 2023 First Impressions supported 10 Early Childhood teachers with scholarships!



BPP GRANTS

The First Impressions Best Practice Program stands out by providing crucial financial support to child care providers and early childhood community partners, enabling them to implement and sustain quality improvement initiatives.

The grand 2022 - 2023 total of BPP was: \$202,500

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A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING APRIL 2023 AS THE MONTH OF THE YOUNG CHILD IN ROUTT COUNTY, COLORADO.

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
